On July 26 our youth, Kyle and I will be leaving for workcamp. The theme for this year's Group workcamp is "Made," based on the Revelation text above. This will be the fourth workcamp St. Luke youth have attended. Each year the number of youth attending has increased. Once the youth attend one camp, they want to attend again. In 2009 six youth



attended; in 2010 that number doubled to twelve; 2011 saw fourteen youth and in 2012 we have fifteen signed up to go. Workcamp (despite it's name) is fun. Our young people meet other youth from across the country. 275 youth are scheduled to attend our workcamp this year. All the youth are divided up into "crews" of six people, all strangers, who will work together repairing a house for five days. Some grow so close they correspond with one another for years to come. One youth I know grew so close to the homeowner, he continued to visit her for years, even attending her funeral. Some deep relationships bloom through workcamp. Each day of workcamp begins with a program that includes a time of devotion. During the day, each crew takes time from the work on their house for a time of devotion as a crew. Then each evening there is a Christ-centered program followed by a devotion time for youth groups. All the devotions are prepared by Group to tie in faith together with the work we are doing. They do an excellent job. Kyle and I have been amazed and joy-filled at the deep and beautiful discussions we have with our youth group in the evening devotion times. I wish each of you could hear both the questions and statements of faith that come from those devotion times. It is a time when our youth have felt "safe" to voice their deepest questions, thoughts and hopes. We have some very wonderful youth and it is a privilege to be part of this journey with them. Thank you for your support.





#### Spotlight on...Al



I was born in a farm house in Cushing, Wisconsin in June 1929. I went to a one room school with no electricity or running water until high school. We had an outhouse in back, also without electricity or running water. I graduated from St. Croix Falls High School in 1947.

After high school I got a job with Western Electric Company, wiring switchboards and line finders. I then moved to Eugene, Oregon for the telephone company when they changed from a manual system to a dial system. I went with a childhood friend who also worked for the telephone company, and lived in a boarding house. I have one of the "new" telephones we installed while in Oregon in the upstairs of our home, and it still works! When I tired of the Oregon life I moved closer to home and came to St. Paul, Minnesota.

I bought a 1930 Packard 4-door convertible with twin spare tires on the front fenders. That car would be worth a mint today, but I sold it for a stock car to race. I rolled and totaled the stock car. I still think it would be fun to drive around a racetrack again! I love to watch NASCAR stock car racing on television.

I was drafted during the Korean War and joined the paratroopers and jumped out of airplanes. When I was discharged I went back to St. Paul and went to St. Paul Vocational School to become a machinist for tool and dye mold making. I followed this profession for my entire working life. While I was still in school I met and married my wife, Phillis Buehler, in 1955, and have been together ever since.

In 1957 we bought a house in St. Paul's Highland Park area and joined St. Luke Lutheran Church in 1958 where our two sons Scott and Roger were baptized and confirmed.

I retired in 1997 and started my hobby of making miniature antique models from wood; items like old horse drawn carriages, road graders, and even cannons!

We have been "Snowbirds" since my retirement, going to Florida 6 months out of the years where it is warm and sunny. I belong to a Sawdust Engineers Club (wood working club) where I make toys, work on my models, and make wooden bowls of different types of wood. You may have seen them at one of the Fall Bazaars. Each year I enter something in the Minnesota and Florida State Fairs. I have won over 50 ribbons so far. I hope I live long enough to make all of the things I want to!

#### STATISTICS <u>DON'T</u> LIE! How to Stay Safe in the World Today: Where IS the Safest Place?

- 1. Avoid riding in automobiles because they are responsible for 20% of all fatal accidents.
- 2. Do not stay home because 17% of all accidents occur in the home.
- 3. Avoid walking on streets or sidewalks because 14% of all accidents occur to pedestrians.
- 4. Avoid traveling by air, rail, or water because 16% of all accidents involve these forms of transportation.
- 5. Of the remaining 33%, 32% of all deaths occur in hospitals. So, above all else, avoid hospitals.

You will be pleased to learn that only .001% of all deaths occur in worship services in church, and these are usually related to previous physical disorders. Therefore, logic tells us that the <u>safest</u> place for you to be at any given point in time is at church!

## 2013 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Booklet: We are


collecting a paragraph from each member to put in a commemorative booklet for our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St. Luke Lutheran next April.
