I have served at St. Luke as a Sunday School and Vacation Bible School teacher, church council commissioner and Fall Bazaar Co-chair, and have been active in Women's Bible Study Circle, Fare For All, and Loaves and Fishes. I also enjoyed singing in the choir; my favorite hymn is "What a Friend We Have in Jesus".

I read a lot. I have sewed all my life, and I also like to knit and crochet.

St. Luke is now the only church in the Homecroft neighborhood; I hope that we will continue to grow with families and children.

News From Council President Joyce Bluel



St. Luke will be celebrating its 100th anniversary in 2013 and has the distinction of being one of the few debt free churches in the ELCA. This has been due in large part to the sale of the parsonage and the wise investment made in the Vanguard Fund. However, in the past few years we have seen these funds diminish at an alarming rate just to keep up with expenses.

Following the November congregational meeting, I was approached by two members that felt we needed to do something to get a handle on our financial situation. It was suggested that a small committee of congregants be formed to look at St. Luke's expenses and revenue and to try and project where we will be five years from now at our current rate of spending. The church council has given its blessing for the formation of this committee and we look forward to their findings and recommendations. If all proceeds as planned, we will have something to report at our May congregational meeting.

I would like to think that St. Luke will still be a fiscally sound and thriving church for generations to come. In order for that to happen, we all have to be good stewards and do our share to ensure that we are able to keep the doors of St. Luke open and our congregation growing.

Which brings me to what many of you may have noticed at the front entrance of our church, the "Welcome Center"; it was an idea introduced by our Evangelism Commissioner, Judy Salaba, to have an area that visitors to St. Luke will readily identify when entering our doors. They will be able to get information regarding activities here at St. Luke, as well as receiving a welcome packet that was put together by our Evangelism Committee. We are looking for volunteers to man the Welcome Center prior to worship and also during coffee fellowship. If you are interested in participating, please talk to Judy.

There are many ways to be good stewards in addition to monetary pledges, the use of your talents to serve on one of our commissions, to sing in the choir, play bells, usher or be part of the altar guild and don't forget our neighborhood fix up project coming in June. It takes many hands to make a congregation work, each one of you is important.
